The **AMG Veritas Global Focus Fund (Class N)** returned 5.20% for the second quarter of 2025, trailing the 11.47% return for its primary benchmark, the MSCI World Index. For the 12-month period ending June 30, 2025, the Fund returned 13.16%, compared with a 16.26% return for the Index.

Market Overview

Global equity markets continued to be dominated by a narrow set of mega-cap technology stocks during Q2 2025. The MSCI World Index rose 11.47% in U.S. Dollar terms, driven by enthusiasm for artificial intelligence (AI) investment and infrastructure spending. Underneath the surface, however, market breadth remained historically narrow, with gains heavily concentrated on a small number of U.S. technology leaders. While many investors continue to focus on rapid AI-driven growth, we see clear parallels with prior capital cycles, most notably the internet infrastructure built out of

the late 1990s. In that period, substantial capital poured into "picks and shovels" providers, only to be followed by severe declines as supply outstripped demand and revenue models proved less resilient than hoped. We believe a similar risk dynamic exists today within Al infrastructure, where high capital intensity, uncertain monetisation paths, and emerging in-house solutions by major buyers create meaningful long-term uncertainties. At the same time, more defensive or less "Al-centric" sectors, including health care, have been left behind despite robust long-term fundamentals. Large parts of the health care market continue to face short-term headwinds, including destocking, muted Chinese demand, and shifts in government health care budgets. Yet, we believe these pressures are cyclical rather than structural, and the secular growth drivers tied to ageing populations and rising global health care demand remain firmly in place.

Investment Review

The AMG Veritas Global Focus Fund rose 5.2% in Q2 2025, underperforming the MSCI World Index's 11.47% return. This relative underperformance was primarily driven by our underweight to the largest U.S. technology stocks and our exposure to select health care holdings. Our positions in Microsoft®, Amazon.com®, and Alphabet contributed positively as they continued to build on their robust core businesses while carefully integrating Al opportunities in a disciplined way. These remain core long-term holdings given their strong balance sheets, large user ecosystems, and ability to self-fund innovation. Conversely, our health care holdings detracted from performance over the quarter. Names such as UnitedHealth Group Incorporated and Becton Dickinson faced renewed investor caution amid sector-specific pressures. We view these near-term challenges as temporary and believe that deferred returns, rather than foregone ones, will ultimately reward patient investors. Our decision to add to UnitedHealth Group reflects this conviction, supported by its differentiated scale advantages and long-term earnings power. While the market's excitement around Al continues to shape headlines and valuations, we are steadfast in our absolute return discipline. Our focus remains on high-quality, cashgenerative businesses with sustainable competitive advantages and pricing power, not simply those best positioned to ride current narratives.

Looking Ahead

Equity markets will likely remain driven by narrow leadership in the near term, but as capital cycles mature, history suggests that breadth tends to improve, and capital shifts back towards underappreciated areas of the market. We believe our balanced exposure to durable growth franchises and select opportunities away from consensus enthusiasm positions the Fund to deliver attractive long-term returns with lower risk. We continue to prioritise resilience and fundamental strength over index-chasing or speculative trends and remain confident that this patient approach will create enduring value for our investors.
